ROLE DEFINITION – TOWN/PARISH COUNCILLORS

Role

- 1. To participate in the governance of the Parish/Town.
- 2. To represent the community to the Council and the Council to the community.
- 3. To promote the Parish/Town as a good place to live and encourage people to participate
- 4. To keep up to date with significant developments affecting the Parish/Town Council.

Commitments

- 1. To attend Parish/Town Council meetings.
- 2. To prepare for meetings and be properly informed about the issues to be discussed.
- 3. To take part in meetings and form sound judgements based on what is best for the community and then abide by majority decisions.
- 4. To assist in the management of the Parish/Town Council in drawing up its strategy, policies and budgets and to help review these when required.
- 5. To participate effectively as a member of any committee or working party to which the Councillor is appointed.
- 6. To listen to local people and represent their interests when discussing council business, and deal with their enquiries and complaints.
- 7. To represent the Parish/Town Council and the whole electorate when serving on outside bodies to which the Councillor is appointed.

Standards of Behaviour

- 1. To uphold the Parish/Town Council's Standing Orders for the conduct of its meetings.
- 2. To maintain high ethical standards in complying with the Code of Conduct for Councillors.
