Re: A46 Alcester Road resurfacing

I'm writing to inform you of some upcoming maintenance works on the A46 near Stratford-upon-Avon.

This work will be carried out by our contractor, Kier, on our behalf.

What we're doing and why? What are the benefits?

We'll be resurfacing the A46 between the A46/A422 Shottery roundabout, and 'The Stag' at Redhill, Stratford-upon-Avon. We'll also be repainting the road markings and replacing the road studs. The work has been identified following the deterioration of the carriageway. The completed work will provide a smoother and safer surface to road users, whilst extending the life of the road and minimising the need for future maintenance.

When will this work take place?

We'll work from **8 June 2020 to 3 July 2020, Monday to Friday, 8pm to 6am**. Access to frontages will be maintained at all times.

Our planned road work may be subject to change due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

What does this mean for you

During closures, we'll provide a fully signed diversion route. The motorway and non-motorway routes are as follows;

A46 Alcester Road motorway diversion; A435 towards Redditch, M42 J3 northbound, at the M42 J3a take the exit for the M40 southbound, leave the M40 at J15, continue along the A46 southbound- and vice versa.

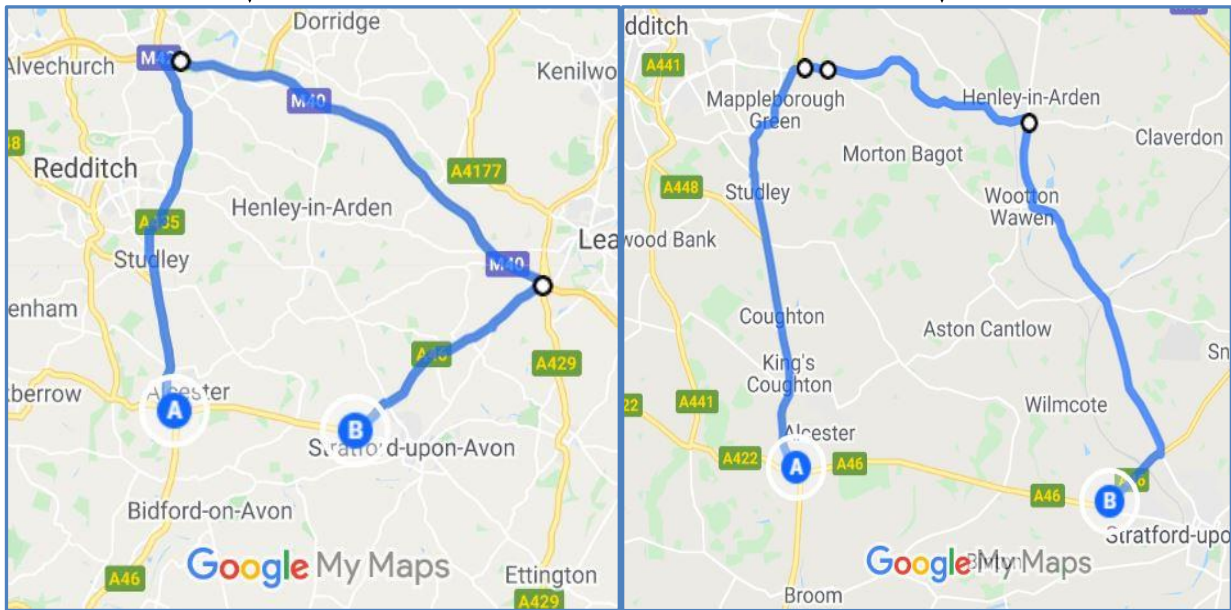
A46 Alcester Road non-motorway diversion; A435 towards Redditch, A4189, A3400, continue along the A46 southbound- and vice versa.

Note- the non-motorway diversion is not suitable for HGV's.

I'd also like to apologise in advance for any inconvenience or disruption to those living close to the work. We'll make every effort to carefully manage noise levels and additional lighting to minimise the impact.
