Site Specific Comments and Notes

Three fields of extant ridge and furrow mapped as part of the South-East Warwickshire and Cotswold Hills HLS. Photos taken in 2012-13 from the air show some of them still surviving. However, google maps also shows ridge and furrow on this site.

The site of a Roman Settlement known from finds of pottery and tiles. The site is locatd 600m north east of the church of Ilmington. 141 sherds of Roman date brought into Warwick Museum. This pottery seems to have a 2nd century to 4th century date range. This scatter has also produced tile, suggesting the presence of a building. This includes a piece of flue tile, which implies the proximity of a building of some substance and sophistication. Independent research undertaken in 2014 confirmed the presence of a Late Iron Age and Roman settlement focus on Windmill Hill. A rapid fieldwalking exercise identified further pottery and roof tiles and complemented a geophysical(fluxgate gradiometer) survey, undertaken at the same time which revealed a sub-rectangular enclosure with peripheral enclosures. There is reference to ridge and furrow from RAF photos taken.
