- Graze sheep and sell their meat to local butchers, last year we had nearly 1,000 sheep that were processed on the farm
- We want to rear goats and again sell their meat to local butchers, we managed to process 250 goats through our farm
- We have chickens whose eggs are passed onto our friends and family

Our ambition is to become self-sufficient and run the farm with green credentials. To this end we have installed a ground source heat pump system which is supported by solar panels to reduce the use of the electricity. The solar panels have been fitted on the roof and the main plant room resides within the building that is currently under dispute. Our ultimate aim is to reintroduce horses into the farm and hopefully one day have showcase or champion horses for the farm that will stand Diana Mason proud.

You will see from the attached roles and responsibilities statement that we require 10 people to run the farm as we have developed it from the non-maintained small holding to an environmentally friendly green small holding operation with the view of further improvements.

This building is essential for our business to be successful, to house and raise the livestock to a standard close to being organic and the meat will be redistributed to the surrounding local community through local butchers. Not only this, the success of our busines plan will generate local employment and in turn support the local community.
