The Site Allocations Plan forms part of the Statutory Development Plan for the District setting out proposals for future development and helping to shape the future of the District to 2031. The Site Allocations Plan sits alongside the Core Strategy and, once adopted, will form part of the Development Plan for Stratford-on-Avon District. These documents, along with Neighbourhood Plans prepared by parish councils, set out the principles and policies against which planning applications are judged. The context for the Site Allocations Plan is set by the Core Strategy which was adopted in July 2016. The Preferred Options Consultation identifies 10 policies and 12 specific site proposals that have emerged through various stages of Plan preparation. The 10 policies are: SAP.1 – Identifying Reserve Housing Sites SAP.2 – Reserve Housing Sites in Neighbourhood Plans SAP.3 – Releasing Reserve Housing Sites SAP.4 – Meeting the needs of Greater Birmingham & Black Country Housing Market Area SAP.5 – Applications for Reserve Housing Sites SAP.6 – Providing for Self-Build and Custom Housebuilding SAP.7 – Delivering Self-Build and Custom Housebuilding SAP.8 – Built-up Area Boundaries SAP.9 – Employment Enabling Sites SAP.9 – Employment Enabling Sites SAP.10 – A46 Safeguarding The 12 site specific proposals are: SUA.2 – South of Alcester Road, Stratford-upon-Avon SUA.4 – Atherstone Airfield SUA.5 – East of Shipston Road, Stratford-upon-Avon SUA.6 – Stratford-upon-Avon Gateway SUA.7 – Rother Street/Grove Road/Greenhill Street, Stratford-upon-Avon SUA.8 – Land at Stratford-upon-Avon College, Alcester Road, Stratford-upon-Avon STUD.1 – Studley Centre RURAL.1 – Napton Brickworks RURAL.2 – University of Warwick, Wellesbourne Campus RURAL.4 – Meon Vale Local Green Space RURAL.5 – Long Marston Airfield Phase 1b

(2) How does it fit with Stratford District Council's wider objectives?	The Revised Preferred Options consultation document is consistent with wider objectives contained in the Core Strategy, Housing Strategy, and Local Industrial and Economic Development Strategy. It is also consistent with 'made' Neighbourhood Plans. The Revised Preferred Options consultation document is also consistent with the District Council's corporate objectives as expressed in its Council Plan 2019-2023.
(3) What are the expected outcomes?	The consultation document is expected to provide certainty to both applicants and the community:
	 Reserve Housing Sites – to rectify any identified shortfall in housing delivery in order to maintain a 5 year supply of housing and to contribute to meeting any identified additional need for housing arising from either within Stratford-on-Avon District or from surrounding areas.
	 Self-build and Custom Housebuilding – to establish a policy to enable the Council to meet its requirement to grant planning permission for enough suitable, serviced plots to meet the demand for self-build and custom housebuilding in its area.
	 Built Up Area Boundaries –to distinguish between land inside the settlement where new development is acceptable 'in principle' from land outside the settlement where, subject to certain exemptions, development is generally not acceptable. Settlement boundaries therefore help prevent encroachment into the countryside.
	- Employment Exceptions Sites - to support 'windfall' employment development in suitable locations that meet identified needs
	 A46 Safeguarding - to safeguard land at two key junctions on the A46 to enable improvements to be implemented when future funding arrangements are in place
	Specific Site Proposals – identify a range of land use allocations identifying acceptable uses, anticipated timescales for delivery and any site specific requirements

The evidence base for the Core Strategy and Site Allocations Plan includes primary and secondary information. This includes studies commissioned to establish the level of housing provision, issues around affordability and deliverability including an up-to-date Strategic Housing Land Availability Assessment (SHLAA). The Sustainability Appraisal/Strategic Environmental Assessment (SA/SEA) also includes consideration of baseline data and the potential for significant effects on people. A Strategic Flood Risk Assessment (SFRA) has also been produced and used to inform the Plan. Specific technical evidence on heritage, landscape and infrastructure capacity has also been used in producing the Plan.
(2) Have you consulted on the plan/ strategy/ service/policy and if so with whom?	The Statement of Community Involvement (SCI) sets out consultation arrangements for producing planning policy documents. The Revised Preferred Options Consultation is subject to 6 weeks consultation from 16 June to 29 July 2022. (3) Which of the groups with protected characteristics have you consulted with?	The consultation set out above is open to all interested parties to participate. The District Council has a database of individuals and organisations that it contacts to inform members of the public and other interested parties at the commencement of consultation on a planning policy document. Any individual, business or group may be placed on the database. Specific groups consulted include Senior Care Action Network (SCAN), Coventry and Warwickshire MIND, Warwickshire Race and Equality Partnership, Equality and Human Rights Commission, Women's Business Council, Gypsy Council and National Federation of Gypsy Liaison Groups.
