

Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year from the Chief Executive

Welcome to our end of year edition of Parish and Partners in which we traditionally look back over the previous 12-months and look forward to new challenges in the New Year.

As you will be aware this has been a year of political change at the Council following the elections in May. For the first time in the history of the Council there is a clear majority for the Liberal Democrat party.

Since May one of the priorities for the Council has been the development of several policies and strategies which will guide the Council's priorities until the next election in 2027.

The most significant of these strategies is the Council Plan 2023-2027, this document sets out the direction of the Council and identifies the Council's key objectives. Thank you so much to everybody that was involved in helping to develop this document either by participating in one of the many focus groups or stakeholder sessions or by responding to the consultation exercise (this generated over 400 responses). The Council Plan was approved by Council at its meeting on 11 December and later in this newsletter there are further details about what the Council will be concentrating on over the next four years, however, the overriding key priorities for the Council will be as follows:

- Residents and Communities
- Delivery of Service
- Local Economy
- Housing
- Climate Change
- Health and Wellbeing

The action plan to support the implementation of the Council will now be developed alongside the budget proposals. The budget will be approved by Council on 26 February 2024, and the action plans at The Cabinet a week later.

In addition to the Council Plan, at the Council meeting on 11 December the South Warwickshire Economic Development Strategy and the Growing Opportunities Plan were also approved.

The vision of the South Warwickshire Economic Development Strategy is: "Our vision for South Warwickshire is that by 2028, Stratford-on-Avon and Warwick District Councils will have contributed to the creation of a larger, stronger, greener and more inclusive economy." The priorities within this joint strategy relate to People, Productivity and Place. It is a very ambitious document which seeks to support the existing businesses in the area and attract new sectors whilst also seeking to de-carbonise the existing economy.

The Growing Opportunities Plan compliments the County Council's Levelling Up which was approved last year. Whilst compared to national statistics the Stratford-on-Avon area is perceived to be an affluent area there are pockets of deprivation across the whole district. The key themes within this Plan are:

- Reducing rural inequalities
- Improving Health and Wellbeing
- Empowering & strengthening local communities
- Improving education & Skills and increasing financial resilience

Again, an action plan to support these areas will be considered by The Cabinet in the New Year.

As you may be aware the Council has recently invited a review of our Planning Service through the Planning Advisory Service. The draft report is currently being finalised, again I would like to thank everybody who took part in this review. There will be some valuable findings in this report which will hopefully help in the way that we work together on this function. In addition to this review the Council has agreed to a Local Government Association Corporate Peer Review. The Corporate Peer Review will consider how the Council operates; however, the core focus of the review will cover leadership, governance, corporate capacity and financial resilience.

Finally, this has been a very busy and challenging year, thank you again for all of your support. I hope that you all manage to get some down time over the Christmas period and I would like to wish you a Merry Christmas and a very happy New Year.





Residents are advised to place their bins, boxes or sacks out for collection by 6am on their scheduled collection day during the festive period.

Extra waste

If you have any additional recycling, you can place it in a box or rigid container next to your blue-lidded wheeled bin for collection.

Please note: No additional general waste (refuse) placed by or on your grey wheeled bin will be collected.

Please remember to put all your food waste in your food caddies and do not dispose of any batteries or electrical waste in your grey bin (general waste).

To ensure that the crews can deal with the increased recycling generated at this time of year, there will be no garden waste collections from Saturday 23 December 2023 through to Saturday 6 January 2024.

Garden waste collections will resume from Monday 8 January 2024...

Real Christmas trees can be cut up and placed in or beside your green wheeled bin for collection, or if you don't subscribe to the garden waste service, it can be put out beside your blue-lidded recycling bin for collection from Monday 8 January until Friday 19 January 2024.

Staying safe this Christmas

The District Council's Rural Crime Advisors are issuing a reminder that, the Christmas holiday period can provide a particularly good opportunity for criminals.

Here are some of the things you can do to reduce your risk of becoming a victim of crime during the festive season.



What can I do to protect my home at Christmas?

- Always keep windows and doors secure.
- Keep presents and valuables out of sight of a wince
- Make your home look lived in when you are out. Consider external lighting, use of switch timers on lamps in different rooms of the house and a TV simulator, these all help to give the illusion that the home is occupied.
- Take care when disposing of wrapping and boxes, particularly from expensive presents, and do not leave them on show outside the house.
- You might also consider registering the items using the free service: immobilise.com
 - If items are then stolen and recovered, it will enable the Police to reunite the items with the owner.
- Avoid keeping large amounts of cash at home.
- Keep entrances of your home and dark corners well lit.
- Consider installing an alarm system / CCTV.
- Where possible, security mark gifts and valuables with your postcode and house number.



In addition you can review security advice on:

- Rural Watch
- Neighbourhood Watch
- Horse Watch
- Business Watch

Also, keep up to date with what's happening in your area by signing up to Warwickshire Connected a free messaging service brought to you by Warwickshire Police where you decide when and how you hear about the issues that matter most to you, whether that be getting regular crime updates, the latest information on ongoing incidents and emergencies or learning more about what your local police are doing.

This is also the place where you can get involved in helping to make your local area a safer place, tell the Police what they should be doing in your area, shape the initiatives that help to keep people and property safe and let the Police know what matters are causing your communities harm.

What about when I'm out shopping?



- Park in a secure car park if one is available to you.
- Park in a busy and well-lit area of the car park, where the view of the car is not obstructed eg by hedges.
- Close windows, sunroof, lock doors and activate security alarms when leaving your car.
- Take all valuables with you when you leave your car.
- Plan your shopping trip to avoid returning to your car to drop off gifts.
- If you have no choice but return to your car to unload, make sure valuables and shopping are locked in the boot; be observant to your surroundings to take care that no-one is watching you.
- Don't unlock your car until you have arrived at your vehicle.
- Always keep your bag and / or wallet with you take care not to put them down whilst you load the car or rearrange your shopping bags.
- Carry your bag in front of you when shopping or if you have a wallet, carry it in a front pocket. Make sure bags and wallets are securely fastened.
- Don't leave your vehicle running if unattended.
- Consider using a faraday pouch for your car key if you
 have a car that has keyless entry. The code from the
 key is constantly transmitting, thieves can steal this
 code, and relay it to your car; once they have the code,
 they don't need your key.
