

HEALTH AND WELLBEING

Health Index (ONS)

The metric is created by synthesising a large number (50+) of health measures which cover a broad range of health-related outcomes, behaviours, persona; circumstances and health-drivers. It covers 3 broad areas:

Healthy People: covering outcomes such as life expectancy, dementia, cancer, disability.

Healthy Lives: covering health-related behaviours such as smoking rates, obesity, drug use.

Healthy Places: covering wider socio-economic drivers of health such as crime, unemployment, poverty, pollution.

Each measure used to calculate the Index metric, as well as the overall Health Index metric itself, is indexed so that the English average = 100, with scores higher than 100 meaning health is better than the English average, and scores lower than 100 meaning health is worse than the English average.

Overall Index Measure

Stratford-on-Avon ranked 38th out of 344 authorities for overall health with a score of 116.5. The 1st ranked authority was Harrogate, with a score of 124.9.

Healthy People Domain

Stratford-on-Avon ranked 32nd out of 344 authorities with a score of 112.7. The top ranked authority was Ealing, with a score of 126.8.

Healthy Lives Domain

Stratford-on-Avon ranked 55th out of 344 authorities with a score of 114.6. The top ranked authority was Waverley, with a score of 129.4.

Healthy Places Domain

Stratford-on-Avon ranked 96th out of 344 authorities with a score of 114.4. The top ranked authority was North Kesteven, with a score of 128.6.

Measures of particular interest – Job-related training and Unemployment

According to ONS, Stratford-on-Avon saw England's greatest worsening in health relating to "economic and working conditions" in the six years between 2015 and 2021. "Economic and working conditions" addresses child poverty, job-related training, unemployment, and workplace safety.

Stratford-on-Avon's score for "economic and working conditions" fell from 126.0 in 2015 to 114.1 in 2021. This means Stratford-on-Avon went from being in the top 1% of local authority areas to being in the top 15% across England for this subdomain.

The change was largely because of an increase in unemployment (the index worsened by 28.6 points) and a worsening in job-related training (a decrease of 23.0).

Measures where Stratford-on-Avon scored below 90 (England average = 100):

- Distance to sports or leisure facilities
- Distance to GP services
- Distance to pharmacies
- Job-related training

PRIDE OF PLACE

SDC Residents' Survey 2022

Overall satisfaction with their local area

86% of those surveyed were satisfied with their local area as a place to live, down five percentage points on 2019 and the lowest score in the last ten years.

Dissatisfaction leapt from 4% in 2019 to 9% in 2022, with 7% fairly dissatisfied and a further 2% very dissatisfied. These dissatisfaction levels are the highest seen over the ten-year period.

Looking at 2022 results analysed by geography and age groups, the following findings were statistically significant:

- Stratford and Wellesbourne/Kineton residents (both 81%) were less likely to be satisfied. Residents in Henley and Studley areas were more likely to be satisfied (both 92%).
- ❖ The younger the resident, the less likely they were to be very satisfied with the area as a place to live.

What's important in making somewhere a good place to live

Residents were asked to say what were the five most important things making somewhere a good place to live. The top five in the District were: the level of crime (58.3%); health services (57.5%); access to the countryside (40.5%); clean streets (35.3%) and affordable decent housing (30.4%).

What things most need improving?

Residents were asked to think about their local area and indicate up to five things that most need improving. The top five improvements were: road and pavement repairs (48.3%); the level of traffic congestion (42.9%); activities for teenagers (33.3%); affordable decent housing (30.2%) and public transport (28.7%).

What things most need improving in Stratford-on-Avon?





Dwellings by Size




The **barriers to housing and services domain** measures the physical and financial accessibility of housing and key local services and is constructed from: -

- Road distance to a post office;
- Road distance to a primary school;
- Road distance to a general store or supermarket;
- Road distance to a GP surgery;
- The proportion of households which are judged to have insufficient space;
- The rate of acceptances for housing assistance under the homelessness provisions of the 1996 Housing Act;
- Difficulty of access to owner-occupation or the private rental market, expressed as the inability to afford to enter owner occupation or the private rental market.
